

PLASTIC (HDPE) MAINTENANCE



GENERAL CLEANING

For general cleaning, lightly scrub the boards with a plastic bristled brush and any of the following products:

- Grease Lightning
- CLR
- Simple Green
- Crust Buster Lime and Scale Remover

WHITE PLASTIC CLEANING

Mr. Clean Magic Eraser works well for cleaning white material.

FINE CLEANING

For fine surface marks, scrub the boards with a mixture of water and TSP (Trisodium Phosphate) which can be found at Home Depot.

TOUGH CLEANING

For tougher stains including rust spots, scrub the boards with Iron Out which can be found at Home Depot.

POWER WASHING

Power Wash boards at a minimum of 12" away with 1500 PSI.

CARE OF RESIN



Depending on where the product is placed determines the frequency it will need to be cleaned. Any foreign substance should be removed from the resin as soon as possible. Avoid areas that will allow the resin to come in contact with fertilizer, salt, tree sap, soda, or other chemicals.

CLEAN THE RESIN

To clean the resin, we recommend using warm water and mild dish soap. For harder stains, you may need to soak the resin with warm water and mild dish soap solution and scrub it with a lint-free cloth. You can also use a mild cleaning solution like "Simple Green" to clean the resin.

PROTECT THE RESIN

To give the resin an added shine and protection you can apply ArmorAll over a clean resin surface. You can also use ArmorAll to rejuvenate your plastic products after cleaning.

WARRANTY

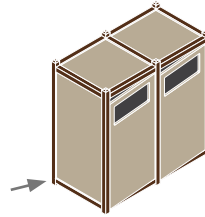

LEVELING

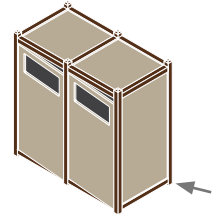
We stand behind our products and value your continued business. Please follow these tips to ensure the longevity of your bins.

1. Place your bin(s) on a hard, flat surface. Observe any rocking.
2. Using your wrench, loosen levelers to lengthen them (clockwise with bin upright).
3. Test bin for rocking and test as necessary.



A. IF DOOR HANGS TO THE LEFT

Increase leveler height under the back left corner post of the product. This will help level the product and correct the door.



B. IF DOOR HANGS TO THE RIGHT

Increase leveler height under the back right corner post of the product. This will help level the product and correct the door.

New furnishings with Ipe will appear smooth and "polished" regardless of staining—this comes from the oil that occurs naturally within the wood. As the oil on the surface evaporates over time, the silver patina begins to emerge. If you wish to maintain the original appearance of your Ipe furnishings, we recommend applying stain 1-2 times annually (4-5 times in harsher environments).

Periodic cleaning of your Ipe Hardwood furnishings is recommended to help maintain appearance and prevent build-up of hard water, dirt and grass. A wide variety of Ipe cleaners can be sourced from your local hardware store or paint supply dealer. It is not essential, but furnishings may be covered when not in use for long periods of time. If you choose to use protective covers we recommend only using "breathable" covers that will not trap humidity, but allow ventilation.
